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

Introduction

 In recent years there have been rapid developments and structural changes in higher education. Universities and university colleges are grouped in associations. As from 2004-2005 they operate within the so-called European Higher Education Area (EHEA) formed by the Bologna process which has initiated a uniform European framework of studies, offering Bachelor and Master degrees.

- After signing the Bologna Declaration the Flemish Minister of Education started a process to reform the Flemish higher education system
- The higher educational system consists of professional Bachelor's Degrees, academic Bachelor and Master Degrees.


Ph D Programmes





ICT service

The ICT service is responsible for developing and monitoring the ICT policy of the university college. The service manages the ICT infrastructure of the university college and manages the administrative network. He provides support to various departments and secretariats and provides advice to the ICT coordinators.

Service internationalization

The service promotes the international activities within the university, the international project work and the international mobility of students and teachers. The service provides the necessary support for the project operations and has an important task of disseminating information. The incoming and outgoing mobility of students and teachers is accompanied by various activities. Moreover, the internationalization service is responsible for the management of the European part of the Erasmus Mundus project.

Quality Management

The quality coordinator encourages and supports the quality policy of the University College. The coordinator supervises the study programmes, departments and services aiming at as much quality in the educational processes as possible. The coordinator accompanies the University College in the pursuit of a quality interpretation of the supporting processes. The quality coordinator coordinate the visitation and accreditation processes at the level of the University College and is responsible for monitoring the Higher Education (HE) database.





Service for educational support and development

The educational support and development service works in the following four areas:

- 1. The service formulates strategic choices, provides support in the implementation of the strategic choices, provides advice to management and follows on innovations in the higher education.
- 2. Use of ICT in education: the service is developing a strategic vision and an action plan and provides the necessary support and training of ICT users.
- 3. Professionalization: The service operates a training policy and organizes training initiatives.
- 4. Quality management: the service provides administrative support in preparing the annual reports and processes the quality surveys.
