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

#### **New situation from October 13**



### Institutions

- 5 universities
- 21 university colleges
- 5 associations, each combining one university and at least one university colleges
- Mergers:
  - Plans for 6 mergers
  - 13 University Colleges in '15 ('16)



#### **VLHORA**

Umbrella organisation for all 21 university colleges (universities of applied science)

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### Start of VLHORA

- In 1994 (new decree on Higher Education) no real representation of University Colleges
- In 1995 start of contacts crossing traditional confessional / non-confessional lines
- 1996 start of VLHORA as a private non-profit organisation
- Gradually all university colleges became a member
- July 7, 1998 special decree establishing VLHORA as official council for the UCs

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#### Decree

- Official partner of the minister
- All UC are member
- Representatives of ministry can join in meetings
- ¾ of votes for a formal stand point
- All financial means come from the members (on basis of their government subsidies)
- Information to be given to the government
- Personnel can be seconded by UC



## Formal assignments

- Official advise by VLHORA asked in several decrees
  - New programmes
  - Names of programmes
  - Qualification structure
  - Quality assurance system
  - •
- Official representation in many bodies
  - Educational council
  - Council on innovation and research
  - Internationalisation
  - ... (many more)



### Mission statement

VLHORA is an umbrella organisation advocating the interests of the university colleges built on a strong and widely accepted view on society.

- -Umbrella organisation
- -Interests of university colleges
- -View on society



### Mission statement

- Voice and spokesperson of the university colleges. Partner of all stakeholders in particular of government
- Active networking in order to promote the added value to society of the university colleges on a national and international level.
- Joint agreements in order to use the public resources as efficiently and effectively as possible



### Mission statement

- Facilitating international policy evaluation and benchmarking through active participation in international networks
- Focussing on a number of specific themes
- Active cooperation in the Flemish Higher Education Council (umbrella organisation together with traditional universities)

# Quality Assurance Agency



- Autonomy in exchange for accountability and quality assurance system
- Ownership of the institutions of HE is stressed by assigning task to the Councils
- Independence is guaranteed by procedures
  - Transparency
  - Peer evaluation
  - External commission
  - Accreditation
- Now transferred to a joint QAA with Universities

## Expenses

- Staff costs (65%)
- Overhead (17%)
  - Premises
  - Maintenance
  - ICT
  - Meeting costs
- Membership, courses and conferences (10%)
- Representation and travelling (3%)
- Investments (3%)
- Rest (2%)



#### **Premises**

- Centre of Brussels (1min from central station)
- One floor with Universities' Rectors' Conference
- Offices and meeting rooms!

# Operations Council (examples)



- Negotiations on collective labour agreements
- Negotiations on new educational legislation
- Standpoints: e.g. tertiary short cycle
- Lobbying: e.g. applied research
- Policy preparation: e.g. integration of Ac programmes
- Consultation: e.g. rationalisation, european rules on certain professions (nursing)

# Operations Council (examples)



- Communication: annual student figures, news letters, press releases (also see lobbying)
- Budget discussions
- Projects (learning outcomes, student affairs ...)
- ICT-contracts
- Electronic information systems package deals

# Why an umbrella organisation



(Also see mission statement and operations before)

- Unity makes stronger (otherwise 'Divide et impera')
- Recognition of a collective identity
- Contact person for government
- Single point of contact for members and other organisations/stakeholders
- Recognised and respected partner
- Defending common interests
- Consultation, bringing people together

# Why an umbrella organisation?



- Economies of scale
- Defending common interests
- Consultation, bringing people togethers
- Communication and information
- Capacity building
- Exchanging best practices / professionalisation
- Stakeholder representation
- International position



## Any reasons why not?

- Compromises/consensus
- Give up some of your individual positions (but benifit from collective force)
- Time needed to come to conclusions (to overcome particular interests)



### International

- Important cooperation on international level, preferably on the level of other conferences/umbrella organisations
  - EURASHE
  - UASNET : especially on research for UAS (10 national conferences)
